(Where are you studying ?) (I am studying Grade 4 at Sweet Valley)

- Na- = **and**

Examples : na- + **ushoti** = **noshoti** (and shorts)
na- + **ihempe** = **nhempe** (and shirt)

- Na- = **with**

na- + **umakhulu** = **nomakhulu** (with granny)
na- + **abazali** = **nabazali** (with parents)

- Question: Uhlala nabani ekhaya? (Who do you live with at home?)
Answer: Ndihlala nomama notata nosisi. (I live with mother, father and sister.)

- How to say "my"- Umama **wam.** (My mother)
- Abazali **bam.** (My parents)
